## Survey of School District Superintendents

In August 1999, the Legislative Auditor's Office conducted a survey of school district superintendents. We asked school districts about their enrollment, staffing, and finances for 1998-2000. We also asked them about budget cuts they have made and about factors contributing to financial pressures they faced.

We received responses from 274 of 349 school districts (79 percent), representing 89 percent of the state's public school enrollment.
