Possible Evaluation Topics for 2026

The Office of the Legislative Auditor (OLA) has prepared background papers on the topic suggestions in **teal**, as directed by the Legislative Audit Commission during the spring topic selection process.

The Evaluation Subcommittee will select an additional five topics for OLA to prepare background papers on and will meet again to approve final topics for the Legislative Audit Commission to consider and approve for evaluation.

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FOLLOW-UP EVALUATIONS

Any follow-up report would review the extent to which an agency had addressed recommendations made in the prior report, in addition to addressing research questions.

Per Legislative Audit Commission policy, the Commission must select at least one of the following topics.
