As part of our evaluation of K-12 Special Education, we wanted to gain a sense of whether parents of students receiving special education were satisfied with the services provided by the local education agencies in which their children were enrolled. To collect information, we conducted a survey of a small sample of parents from each of the eight local education agencies we visited through our case studies. (Local education agencies selected for case studies are described in Appendix A of our report.) We tied our survey to our other evaluation activities by asking some questions that were similar to those discussed in our focus groups and our case study interviews.

We sent questionnaires to the parents of 24 students who received special education from one of our case study districts during the 2010-2011 school year. To create our sample, we randomly selected three students from each of the eight local education agencies we visited. While the responses we received from our small sample are not generalizable to all parents, they helped give some insight into parent's feelings about special education in the case study districts.

Because we anticipated that parents would be unfamiliar with our office, we requested special education directors to e-mail or telephone the parents and alert them to the coming questionnaire. We mailed our questionnaire to the parents of selected students on November 5, 2012. The mailing included a cover letter, background information about the evaluation, the one-page questionnaire, and a postage-paid return envelope. We asked parents to return their questionnaires no later than November 15, 2012. We followed up by telephone with the parents who had not responded and mailed final reminders, along with a new copy of the questionnaire, on November 27, 2012. We ultimately received 11 responses for a response rate of 46 percent.


