

## **Public Health Care Eligibility Determination for Noncitizens** Update to 2006 Evaluation Report

## **Problems Identified**

- **Frequent Eligibility Determination Errors.** Over 70 percent of the eligibility determination cases we reviewed contained errors; 18 percent had errors that affected eligibility for benefits. Errors included case workers not validating applicants' immigration status, entering an incorrect immigration status in MAXIS, and not requiring current immigration documents.
- **Sponsors' Income Not Considered.** In over 10 percent of all cases we reviewed, county case workers did not properly identify or count sponsors' income when determining eligibility. This error affected eligibility in every case.
- **Inadequate Training and Resources.** The Department of Human Services (DHS) did not provide a noncitizen eligibility specialist for county staff to contact with questions regarding noncitizen eligibility determination. In addition, DHS' published noncitizen eligibility guidelines, the "Guide to Non-Citizen Eligibility," contained known inaccuracies and had not been updated for several years.
- Unclear Requirements. County staff with whom we met had different understandings about when they were required or allowed to conduct electronic validation of noncitizens' immigration status.

## **Changes Implemented**

• **Improved Training and Resources.** By the end of 2006, DHS published updated noncitizen eligibility guides for cash, food support, and health care programs. DHS also provided additional training on electronic validation of noncitizens' immigration status.

## Action Needed

- **Clarify Requirements.** DHS or the Legislature should develop specific guidelines regarding when county human services staff should electronically validate a recipient's immigration status. Consistent with our recommendations, the Governor's 2008-09 budget proposes requiring electronic validation of a recipient's immigration status at each annual eligibility recertification.
- **Provide Resources.** DHS should designate a noncitizen eligibility specialist to assist county staff with eligibility determinations.
- **Continue Oversight.** Given the high error rate we found for the eligibility determination cases included in our review, DHS should closely monitor counties' eligibility determination of noncitizen recipients.
